| <b>10</b>       | <b>MICHAEL CRABTREE</b>    | I'd rather be lucky than good, should be the mantra in the Bay Area. 9 teams passed on CRABTREE giving the Niners a shot at the best WR in the DRAFT. If he puts his ego in his back pocket and is willing to learn from BRUCE this is a bonanza. Now if only someone can get him the ball. | WR         | 6'2           | 215           | TEXAS TECH    |
| <b>74</b>       | <b>GLENN COFFEE</b>        | A talented, slashing runner with more quickness and strength than pure speed. Can keep the chains moving and will run inside or out. He should provide a very viable compliment to GORE. Solid value Pick at a position of need.  | RB         | 6'0           | 210           | ALABAMA       |
| <b>156</b>      | <b>SCOTT McKILLOP</b>      | A tough as nails, no nonsense football player who just goes out and makes plays week after week. He's like a full sized ZACH THOMAS and will work his way into the ILB rotation very soon. Can take advantage of all the attention given to WILLIS.   | ILB        | 6'1           | 244           | PITT          |
| <b>171</b>      | <b>NATE DAVIS</b>          | I'm still not convinced that DAVIS is a future NFL starting QB. Not a big risk in R5, but then again a losing team can't gamble on too many Picks when they have so many needs. We'll look back at this one in 3 years and evaluate the Pick value.   | QB         | 6'2           | 226           | BALL STATE    |
| <b>184</b>      | <b>BEAR PASCOE</b>         | Nice selection for both value and need. He is a DITKA type throwback who blocks like hell, and runs over people after he catches the ball. Is the antithesis of VERNON DAVIS, and his tough guy persona will come in handy a few times this year.   | TE         | 6'5           | 250           | FRESNO STATE  |
| <b>219</b>      | <b>CURTIS TAYLOR</b>       | Nice selection here. TAYLOR needs some coaching-up, but has more natural talent than your usual R7 Pick. Should be able to help out on ST, while the coaches figure out how to develop his talent in the secondary.   | SS         | 6'3           | 209           | LSU           |
| <b>244</b>      | <b>RICKY JEAN-FRANCOIS</b> | A great value pick in R7, but I'd be more excited if the Niners played a 4-3 scheme. His size is somewhat problematic in a 3-4. He may become the new poster boy for the stay-in-school until you produce on the field campaign 2009.   | DT         | 6'3           | 295           | LSU           |
