104	KALUKA MAIAVA	OK I am going to say it again. This is way too soon to draft a Special Teams player. I think too many folks decided this is a good player because he started at USC. 177	DON CAREY	I think this is a high potential pick. He is nowhere near ready to contribute much in the secondary right now, but he shows lots of athleticism and potential. For a team in a rebuilding process his upside is worth the risk in R6.	CB	5'11	190	NORFOLK STATE
191	COYE FRANCIES	He has the talent to be a Top 100 Prospect, but the head to get into trouble. As long as they think they have a way to baby sit the guy this is a very high risk/reward Pick. 195	JAMES DAVIS	You have done a fine job when you can get, at the least, your No. 3 RB near the end of R6. The only real big knocks on DAVIS are that he can't catch out of the backfield, and doesn't have break away speed.
