I bumped him down because he gained almost 15 pounds between the COMBINE and his Pro Day. Reports were he couldn't even finish some of the drills. That scares me off a Pick this high. 45	CLINT SINTIM	I really like this Pick for a Giants team that needs more talent at the LB position in my mind. SINTIM will take a little while to adjust back to a 4-3 scheme, but he has the size, speed and intelligence to make the move. He was a borderline First Rounder until struggling to make plays in Mobile.	OLB	6'3	255	VIRGINIA
60	WILLIAM BEATTY	There is work to be done here, but it is abundantly clear that BEATTY has the athleticism to excel in the NFL. He could push DIEHL back inside or McKENZIE out of town in a couple of years. They need to get him up to a solid 315 and stronger in the upper body. Good value pick here with tremendous upside. 85	RAMSES BARDEN	It won't be this year, but this guy has the talent and body to be that big deep threat that PLAXICO was. I liken him to T.O. coming out of Chattanooga some time ago.
