8	EUGENE MONROE	Sometimes it just can't be glamorous and you have to Draft to build in the trenches. This Pick is the beginning of the rebuild. MONROE doesn't have the potential to dominate like Andre Smith, but he is ready to play now and will do everything asked of him, and do it well. What you see is what you get and it is solid. 39	EBEN BRITTON	So now they have taken care of both OT positions for the foreseeable future. An intelligent, athletic young man, BRITTON may take a year or two of coaching to excel, but the potential is there. After years of just getting by at an important position the team now has solid bookend OTs. Good value here.	OT	6'6	310	ARIZONA
72	TERRANCE KNIGHTON	Tell me they didn't miss STROUD big time last year. HENDERSON was outmanned with small teammates all around him. KNIGHTON is designed to fix that situation. He is a little raw, but he is a good athlete with functional strength and some quickness. He may take a while to reach his potential, but he should upgrade their interior DL.	DT	6'3	320	TEMPLE
73	DEREK COX	Someone in their Scouting Department fell in love here. COX was a late round value at best. He has nice size and speed, but will require a lot of coaching to make the transition from small school to the NFL. If he is the sleeper of the DRAFT I'll eat my words eventually, but this is a big reach looking at it today.	CB	6'1	198	WILLIAM & MARY
107	MIKE THOMAS	So let's get one issue on the table right away; he's awfully short. Now beyond that he is a dynamic player with good hands, speed and quickness and exceptional return skills. As long as you don't see him as your No.1 guy, this is a solid choice. He can contribute in many ways and should improve field position in every game.	WR/RS	5'8	195	ARIZONA STATE
144	JARRETT DILLARD	I also like this selection quite a bit. The JAGS just cleaned house on big athletic receivers like PORTER & JONES, who couldn't run crisp patterns and catch the ball consistently. DILLARD excels at getting open from the slot and not dropping anything once it touches his hands. He can catch 50 balls a year as a No. 4 slot guy.	WR	5'10	190	RICE
180	ZACH MILLER	This may be a reach, but in R6 it's not going to kill them even if it is. This small school star is a super athlete who may be a jumbo sized Spread Package QB. He can also line up at TE in passing situations. Watch for his name in 2010.	ATH/ TE	6'4	235	NE/OMAHA
250	RASHAD JENNINGS	I'm perplexed that he lasted this long, but it makes this a very high value Pick. JENNINGS is not a feature back, but he has the talent to be a very solid compliment to mighty-mite JONES-DREW. I see this pick bringing good value to their roster.	RB	6'1	230	LIBERTY
253	TIQUAN UNDERWOOD	The only question here is how he fits in with the crowded position group. But for three years he was the most reliable receiver for a resurgent RUTGERS team. He has decent size and speed and shows good hands. He could become a reliable possession receiver in the NFL. High value this late.	WR	6'1	185	RUTGERS

Let's not try to bury anyone, but I can see the difference in this DRAFT without JAMES HARRIS at the controls. It is flat out better and more logical in its totality. It is a better mix of need-filling as well as Value for the Pick. It's not a great DRAFT, but it gives DEL RIO and his staff more solid players to work with than in recent years. Whether it's enough to save his job we'll probably know by October.
