9	C.J. SPILLER	The BILLS Offense has been shy of weapons for some time now. SPILLER will help fix that, at least until December in Buffalo. They need to limit his touches and max his explosiveness in light of his size limitations. He's REGGIE BUSH at 20 touches a game.	RB/RS	5'11	195	CLEMSON
41	TORELL TROUP	I would have liked this Pick in another two Rounds, but this is a reach. TROUP is fairly strong, with good athleticism, but he doesn't finish off many plays. I'm also not convinced he fits on the Nose.	DT	6'3	315	CENTRAL FLORIDA
72	ALEX CARRINGTON	This could be a great Pick, but not right away. They will need to be patient with a guy who needs more strength and technique to play at an NFL level. The sky could be the limit if their coaches can develop him. <u>Good value at the Pick, but patience is required.</u>	DE	6'5	285	ARKANSAS STATE
107	MARCUS EASLEY	Another solid selection, who may not be quite ready to have an immediate impact. He came on strong as a senior @ UCONN, but may be overwhelmed initially by NFL CBs.	WR	6'3	210	UCONN
140	ED WANG	This guy is massive, & more athletic than many think. He provides good value in Round 5, but is also going to be a project. They might be best served to start him out at RT, and move him over in a year or two.	OT	6'5	315	VA TECH
178	ARTHUR MOATS	He could be a very productive 3-4 OLB in time. But after playing DE at the D2 level it is unrealistic to suppose he can step in right away and have an impact. Another value Pick in need of coaching-up.	OLB	6'0	245	JAMES MADISON
192	DANNY BATTEN	A very solid, small-school prospect, who will also have to make the transition from a hand-down DE to an OLB in a 3-4 scheme. Tell me if you perceive a pattern here... he's a project.	OLB	6'2	245	S. DAKOTA STATE
209	LEVI BROWN	GAILEY will need to find a way to cut one of his veteran QBs and keep this guy around. Unless TRENT EDWARDS bounces back from a disappointing 2009, BROWN could be their most talented QB, but will need a couple of years to be ready to start in the League.	QB	6'3	225	TROY
216	KYLE CALLOWAY	CALLOWAY is a solid, long OT. But he is slow, and his footwork is pretty bad when facing an athletic pass-rusher. I don't know how you coach-up plodders. Maybe he can contribute as a back-up RT, but...	OT	6'7	322	IOWA

There is a reasonable amount of talent in this group. And many of these guys are at positions of need for the BILLS right now. But the problem will likely be that very few of these players are ready to have an immediate impact in the NFL. And with a 10-loss team fan patience is going to be limited. This DRAFT Class could provide a big talent boost to the BILLS roster, but I fear the fans won't see their impact for at least another season. Good luck rationalizing this group when most of them are on the bench when September rolls around.
