92	SHAUN LAUVAO	A stout, fairly athletic college OT who may translate quite nicely to an OG position where his lack of height will not matter. He is very physical and seems to understand what the O is trying to do around him.	OG	6'2	315	ARIZONA STATE
160	LARRY ASANTE	ASANTE is more of a thumper than an all-around S. He should be a solid, in-the-box SS in the Red Zone, where his lack of cover skills can be somewhat masked. His biggest contribution could come on ST.	SS	6'0	210	NEBRASKA
177	CARLTON MITCHELL	MITCHELL is raw and a bit immature, but is a great upside value Pick this late in the process. He may see time early as a downfield threat while he learns the nuances of playing WR in the NFL.	WR	6'3	215	SOUTH FLORIDA
186	CLIFTON GEATHERS	There has been talk about moving GEATHERS to OT because of his feet and length. But he could also be a pass rush specialist for the D. I think he was better suited to a 4-3 scheme if he stays on D.	DE	6'7	300	SOUTH CAROLINA
TRADE	SHELDON BROWN	In essence he cost the team Picks 105 & 137, which is a bit steep for a 30+-year old guy who may only be their Nickel Corner, after the Drafting of HADEN.	CB			

On a couple of occasions HOLMGREN was rather cavalier (sorry LaBron) in dealing away Picks to gain a little positioning here and there. I like HARDESTY, but giving up Picks 71, 134, 146 was a bit steep to move up 12 slots into Round 2 to get him. Considering the players they got rid of (QUINN, WILLIAMS, J. HALL, etc) ending up with only 8 DRAFT selections was disappointing for my taste. Seems to me that they may have outsmarted themselves in some of their transactions. The Emperor is just not RON WOLF on Personnel evaluations. They improved their team with this DRAFT, but not dramatically. I have to say the effort was very average overall, thus the C.
