When you roll in MARSHALL and DOBBINS as part of the process, this is a very effective, though not glamorous DRAFT. I think it is interesting to note that their first 4 Picks all played in the Senior Bowl, where their staff coached the South Squad. This DRAFT is typical PARCELLS with lots of big, physical guys who fit the team's schemes. That sounds basic and logical, but not all teams approach the DRAFT in that manner. This group seriously improves the roster, and should allow the team to bounce back into Play-Off onctnention in 2010... and beyond.
