10	TYSON ALUALU	I like TYSON, and am thinking he will start right away, inside for the JAGS. But he is not high value as the 10th overall player selected. He improves their front-4 immediately.	DT	6'3	295	CAL
74	D'ANTHONY SMITH	I was very disappointed in SMITH during SR Bowl week. He made very few plays and little impact, even in practice. I think he will need lots of coaching and several years to contribute.	DT	6'2	305	LA TECH
143	LARRY HART	I have heard they see him in a pure pass-rushing role as an undersized DE, having no intention of converting him to OLB. This team cannot afford the luxury of that kind of Pick in any Round. I think he will fade into oblivion and be gone in a couple of years.	OLB/E	6'1	250	CENTRAL ARKANSAS
153	AUSTEN LANE	Their best Value Pick of the process. He has the potential to be a starting DE with good pass-rush ability. I expect him to add another 10-15 lbs. and be a huge size/speed mismatch for a lot of Ots. They will need to be patient because of his college level of competition.	DE	6'6	275	MURRAY STATE
180	DEJI KARIM	This was an OK Pick. KARIM shows some quickness, and explosiveness through the hole to possibly blossom as a 3rd Down RB. The big key to his value will be as a receiver out of backfield.	RB	5'11	205	SOUTHERN ILLINOIS
203	SCOTTY McGEE	They need help in their return game, but I just don't see how this team can afford to use a 6th Round Pick on an undersized RS, who comes from a D2 program.	RS/CB	5'9	190	JAMES MADISON
LB	KIRK MORRISON	This is one of their few plusses from the 2010 DRAFT process. In essence they got he and LANE for JACOBY FORD. Can you say steal?! He is not a Pro Bowler, but he is all over the field and makes lots of tackles, though most of them are well downfield.				

I find this DRAFT effort to be puzzling, and woefully inadequate for a team teetering on the cusp of falling from Play-Off contention as they reshape their roster. I hope JACK DEL RIO had a big part in this effort, because the fruits of it are not going to do much to help him keep his job. If I didn't know JAMES HARRIS was employed elsewhere, I'd swear G.M. GENE SMITH invited his old boss back to consult with him on this effort. SMITH should have been able to find a partner to allow him to trade down from Pick 10, add a later Pick and still get his man ALUALU. This is clearly the worst DRAFT of 2010.
